## 1. Introduction

This privacy notice supplements other notices and privacy policies and is not intended to override them.

## 2.2 Controller

This privacy notice is issued on behalf of B\_H K (Flooring) Limited so when we mention "Slatdecor", "we", "us or "our" in this privacy notice, we are referring to B\_H\_K (Flooring) Limited who is responsible for collecting and processing your personal data. B\_H\_K (Flooring) Limited is the controller and responsible for this website.

B\_H\_K (Flooring) Limited's registered office is at Davy Drive, North West Industrial Estate, Peterlee, County Durham, SR8 2JF and we are a company registered in England and Wales under company number 05521344. We are registered with the ICO Public Data Protection Register with registration number ZB552457.

## 3. The data we collect about you

Personal data, or personal information, means any information about an individual from which that person can be identified. It does not include data where the identity has been removed (anonymous data).

- 3.1 We may collect, use, store and transfer different kinds of personal data about you which we have grouped together as follows:
  - 3.1.1 Identity Data includes first name, last name, title and date of birth.
  - 3.1.2 Contact Data includes billing address, delivery address, email address and telephone number(s).
  - 3.1.3 Financial Data includes payment card details.
  - 3.1.4 Technical Data includes internet protocol (IP) address, your login data, browser type and version, time zone setting and location, browser plug-in types and versions,

- operating system and platform, and other technology on the devices you use to access this website.
- 3.1.5 Profile Data includes purchases or orders made by you, your ID number for payments made by you, your preferences, feedback and survey responses.
- 3.1.6 **Usage Data** includes information about how you use our website and products.
- 3.1.7 Marketing and Communications Data includes your preferences in receiving marketing from us and our third parties and your communication preferences.
- 3.2 We also collect, use and share Aggregated Data such as statistical or demographic data for any purpose. Aggregated Data could be derived from your personal data but is not considered personal data in law as this data will not directly or indirectly reveal your identity. For example, we may aggregate your Usage Data to calculate the percentage of users accessing a specific website feature. However, if we combine or connect Aggregated Data with your personal data so that it can directly or indirectly identify you, we treat the combined data as personal data which will be used in accordance with this privacy policy.
- 3.3 We do not collect any Special Categories of Personal Data about you (this includes details about your race or ethnicity, religious or philosophical beliefs, sex life, sexual orientation, political opinions, trade union membership, information about your health, and genetic and biometric data). Nor do we collect any information about criminal convictions and offences.
- 3.4 If you fail to provide personal data
  - 3.4.1 Where we need to collect personal data by law, or under the terms of a contract we have with you, and you fail to provide that data when requested, we may not be able to perform the contract we have or are trying to enter into with you (for example, to provide you with goods or services). In this case, we may have to cancel a product or service you have with us but we will notify you if this is the case at the time.
- 4. How is your personal data collected?
- 4.1 We use different methods to collect data from and about you including through:
  - 4.1.1 Direct interactions. You may give us your Identity, Contact and Financial Data by filling in forms or by corresponding with us by post or email or otherwise. This includes personal data you provide when you:
    - 4.1.1.1 purchase our products;

- 4.1.1.2 subscribe to our mailing list/publications;
- 4.1.1.3 request marketing to be sent to you;
- 4.1.1.4 send us photographs of your use of our products;
- 4.1.1.5 complete a survey; or
- 4.1.1.6 give us feedback or contact us.
- 4.1.2 Automated technologies or interactions. As you interact with our website, we will automatically collect Technical Data about your equipment, browsing actions and patterns. We collect this personal data by using cookies, server logs and other similar technologies. We may also receive Technical Data about you if you visit other websites employing our cookies. Please see our use of cookies below for further details.
- 4.1.3 **Third parties or publicly available sources.** We will receive personal data about you from various third parties and public sources as set out below.
  - 4.1.3.1 Technical Data from the following parties:
    - 4.1.3.1.1 analytics providers such as Google based outside the UK;
    - 4.1.3.1.2 advertising networks such as Facebook, Instagram, Etsy and Pinterest based outside the UK; and
    - 4.1.3.1.3 search information providers Google based outside the UK.
  - 4.1.3.2 Contact, Financial and Transaction Data from providers of technical, payment and delivery services Stripe based outside the UK.
  - 4.1.3.3 Identity and Contact Data from publicly available sources such as Companies House and the Electoral Register based inside the UK.

## 5. How we use your personal data

- We will only use your personal data when the law allows us to. Most commonly, we will use your personal data in the following circumstances:
  - 5.1.1 where we need to perform the contract we are about to enter into or have entered into with you;
  - 5.1.2 where it is necessary for our legitimate interests (or those of a third party) and your interests and fundamental rights do not override those interests;
  - 5.1.3 where we need to comply with a legal obligation; and/or
  - 5.1.4 where we have obtained your consent.

- 5.2 We have set out below, in a table format, a description of all the ways we plan to use your personal data, and which of the legal bases we rely on to do so. We have also identified what our legitimate interests are where appropriate.
- 5.3 Note that we may process your personal data for more than one lawful basis depending on the specific purpose for which we are using your personal data. # 5.4 Marketing

5.4.1 We strive to provide you with choices regarding certain personal data uses, particularly around marketing and advertising.

## 5.5 Promotional offers from us

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- 5.5.1 We may use your Identity, Contact, Technical, Usage and Profile Data to form a view on what we think you may want or need, or what may be of interest to you. This is how we decide which products, services and offers may be relevant for you (we call this marketing).
- 5.5.2 You will receive marketing communications from us if you have requested information from us or purchased goods from us and you have not opted out of receiving that marketing. For marketing purposes, we rely on the lawful bases 'legitimate interest' and/or 'consent' as a basis for processing your personal data.

## 5.6 Third-party marketing

5.6.1 We will get your express opt-in consent before we share your personal data with any third party for marketing purposes.

## 5.7 Opting out

- 5.7.1 You can ask us or third parties to stop sending you marketing messages at any time by following the opt-out links on any marketing message sent to you or by contacting us at any time.
- 5.7.2 Where you opt out of receiving these marketing messages, this will not apply to personal data provided to us as a result of a product purchase, warranty registration, product experience or other transactions.

## 5.8 Change of purpose

- 5.8.1 We will only use your personal data for the purposes for which we collected it, unless we reasonably consider that we need to use it for another reason and that reason is compatible with the original purpose. If you wish to get an explanation as to how the processing for the new purpose is compatible with the original purpose, please contact
- 5.8.2 If we need to use your personal data for an unrelated purpose, we will notify you and we will explain the lawful basis which allows us to do so.
- 5.8.3 Please note that we may process your personal data without your knowledge or consent, in compliance with the above rules, where this is required or permitted by law.

#### 6. Cookies

- 6.1 Our website uses cookies to distinguish you from other users of our website. This helps us to provide you with a good experience when you browse our website and also allows us to improve our site.
- 6.2 A cookie is a small file of letters and numbers that we store on your browser or the hard drive of your computer if you agree. Cookies contain information that is transferred to your computer's hard drive.
- 6.3 We use the following cookies:
  - 6.3.1 Strictly necessary cookies. These are cookies that are required for the operation of our website. They include, for example, cookies that enable you to log into secure areas of our website, use a shopping cart or make use of e-billing services.
  - 6.3.2 Analytical or performance cookies. These allow us to recognise and count the number of visitors and to see how visitors move around our website when they are using it. This helps us to improve the way our website works, for example, by ensuring that users are finding what they are looking for easily.
  - 6.3.3 **Functionality cookies.** These are used to recognise you when you return to our website. This enables us to personalise our content for you, greet you by name and remember your preferences (for example, your choice of language or region).
  - 6.3.4 **Targeting cookies.** These cookies record your visit to our website, the pages you have visited and the links you have followed. We will use this information to make our website and the advertising displayed on it more relevant to your interests.

- 6.7 You can choose which analytical, functionality and targeting cookies we can set by clicking on the cookie pop-up and setting your preference to the type of cookies we can use to collect your personal data.
- 6.8 However, if you use your browser settings to block all cookies (including strictly necessary cookies) you may not be able to access all or parts of our website.

## 7. Disclosures of your personal data

- 7.1 We may share your personal data with the parties set out below for the purposes set out in the table under *How we use your personal data* above.
  - 7.1.1 Internal Third Parties includes other companies in the B\_H\_K (Flooring) Limited group of companies acting as joint controllers or processors (including BHK (UK) Limited) and who are based inside the UK and provide IT and system administration services and undertake leadership reporting.

## 7.1.2 External Third Parties includes:

- 7.1.2.1 service providers acting as processors based inside the UK who provide IT and system administration services;
- 7.1.2.2 professional advisers acting as processors, controllers or joint controllers including lawyers, bankers, auditors and insurers based inside the UK who provide consultancy, banking, legal, insurance and accounting services; and
- 7.1.2.3 HM Revenue & Customs, regulators and other authorities acting as processors, controllers or joint controllers based inside the UK who require reporting of processing activities in certain circumstances.

## 7.1.3 Specific third parties includes, but is not limited to:

- 7.1.3.1 courier system providers such as Tuffnells and Parcelforce;
- 7.1.3.2 website design and management providers such as Pivotal Web; and
- 7.1.3.3 other e-commerce providers such as Etsy and Pinterest.

- 7.1.4 Third parties to whom we may choose to sell, transfer or merge parts of our business or our assets. Alternatively, we may seek to acquire other businesses or merge with them. If a change happens to our business, then the new owners may use your personal data in the same way as set out in this privacy notice.
- 7.2 We require all third parties to respect the security of your personal data and to treat it in accordance with the law. We do not allow our third-party service providers to use your personal data for their own purposes and only permit them to process your personal data for specified purposes and in accordance with our instructions.

## 8. International transfers

8.1 We do not transfer your personal data outside the UK.

#### 9. Data security

- 9.1 We have put in place appropriate security measures to prevent your personal data from being accidentally lost, used or accessed in an unauthorised way, altered or disclosed. In addition, we limit access to your personal data to those employees, agents, contractors and other third parties who have a business need to know. They will only process your personal data on our instructions and they are subject to a duty of confidentiality.
- 9.2 We have put in place procedures to deal with any suspected personal data breach and will notify you and any applicable regulator of a breach where we are legally required to do so.

## 10. Data retention

- 10.1 We will only retain your personal data for as long as reasonably necessary to fulfil the purposes we collected it for, including for the purposes of satisfying any legal, regulatory, tax, accounting or reporting requirements. We may retain your personal data for a longer period in the event of a complaint or if we reasonably believe there is a prospect of litigation in respect to our relationship with you.
- 10.2 To determine the appropriate retention period for personal data, we consider the amount, nature and sensitivity of the personal data, the potential risk of harm from unauthorised use or disclosure of your personal data, the purposes for which we process your personal data and whether we can achieve those purposes through other means, and the applicable legal, regulatory, tax, accounting or other requirements. Please see our applicable retention periods below.

- 11.3 You have the right to make a complaint at any time to the Information Commissioner's Office ("ICO"), the UK regulator for data protection issues (<u>www.ico.org.uk</u>). We would, however, appreciate the chance to deal with your concerns before you approach the ICO so please contact us in the first instance.
- 11.4 No fee usually required

11.4.1 You will not have to pay a fee to access your personal data (or to exercise any of the other rights). However, we may charge a reasonable fee if your request is clearly unfounded, repetitive or excessive. Alternatively, we could refuse to comply with your request in these circumstances.

## 11.5 What we may need from you

11.5.1 We may need to request specific information from you to help us confirm your identity and ensure your right to access your personal data (or to exercise any of your other rights). This is a security measure to ensure that personal data is not disclosed to any person who has no right to receive it. We may also contact you to ask you for further information in relation to your request to speed up our response.

#### 11.6 Time limit to respond

11.6.1 We try to respond to all legitimate requests within one month. Occasionally it could take us longer than a month if your request is particularly complex or you have made a number of requests. In this case, we will notify you and keep you updated.

## 12. Glossary

- 12.1 Legitimate Interest means the interest of our business in conducting and managing our business to enable us to give you the best service/product and the best and most secure experience. We make sure we consider and balance any potential impact on you (both positive and negative) and your rights before we process your personal data for our legitimate interests. We do not use your personal data for activities where our interests are overridden by the impact on you (unless we have your consent or are otherwise required or permitted to by law). You can obtain further information about how we assess our legitimate interests against any potential impact on you in respect of specific activities by contacting us.
- 12.2 **Performance of Contract** means processing your data where it is necessary for the performance of a contract to which you are a party or to take steps at your request before entering into such a contract.
- 12.3 **Comply with a legal obligation** means processing your personal data where it is necessary for compliance with a legal obligation that we are subject to.
- 12.4 **Consent** means offering you a real choice and control over how we use your personal data.
- 12.5 YOUR LEGAL RIGHTS

## 12.5.1 You have the right to:

- 12.5.1.1 Request access to your personal data (commonly known as a "data subject access request"). This enables you to receive a copy of the personal data we hold about you and to check that we are lawfully processing it.
- 12.5.1.2 Request correction of the personal data that we hold about you. This enables you to have any incomplete or inaccurate data we hold about you corrected, though we may need to verify the accuracy of the new data you provide to us.
- 12.5.1.3 Request erasure of your personal data. This enables you to ask us to delete or remove personal data where there is no good reason for us continuing to process it. You also have the right to ask us to delete or remove your personal data where you have successfully exercised your right to object to processing (see below), where we may have processed your information unlawfully or where we are required to erase your personal data to comply with local law. Note, however, that we may not always be able to comply with your request of erasure for specific legal reasons which will be notified to you, if applicable, at the time of your request.
- 12.5.1.4 **Object to processing** of your personal data where we are relying on a legitimate interest (or those of a third party) and there is something about your particular situation which makes you want to object to processing on this ground as you feel it impacts on your fundamental rights and freedoms. You also have the right to object where we are processing your personal data for direct marketing purposes. In some cases, we may demonstrate that we have compelling legitimate grounds to process your information which override your rights and freedoms.
- 12.5.1.5 **Request restriction of processing** of your personal data. This enables you to ask us to suspend the processing of your personal data in the following scenarios:

- 12.5.1.5.1 If you want us to establish the data's accuracy.
- 12.5.1.5.2 Where our use of the data is unlawful but you do not want us to erase it.
- 12.5.1.5.3 Where you need us to hold the data even if we no longer require it as you need it to establish, exercise or defend legal claims.
- 12.5.1.5.4 You have objected to our use of your data but we need to verify whether we have overriding legitimate grounds to use it.
- 12.5.1.6 Request the transfer of your personal data to you or to a third party. We will provide to you, or a third party you have chosen, your personal data in a structured, commonly used, machine-readable format. Note that this right only applies to automated information which you initially provided consent for us to use or where we used the information to perform a contract with you.
- 12.5.1.7 Withdraw consent at any time where we are relying on consent to process your personal data. However, this will not affect the lawfulness of any processing carried out before you withdraw your consent. If you withdraw your consent, we may not be able to provide certain products or services to you. We will advise you if this is the case at the time you withdraw your consent.
